But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.
