First Reading: Acts 2.42-47 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Gospel Reading: John 10.1-10

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you O Lord.

Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognise a stranger's voice.' Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them. Therefore Jesus said again, 'Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you O Christ.**

The Coronation: we hope you have picked up one of the booklets with prayers and reflections leading up to the day of King Charles' Coronation on 6 May, if not pick one up from either church. **On Sunday 7 May** we will have services of celebration to commemorate the Coronation at both of our churches, and at St Mary's we will have cake with the refreshments. The PCC decided that we should encourage people to celebrate locally in the afternoon, to join with neighbours or bigger events in the local area. One such celebration will be at Queens Park, Coronation Picnic in the Park, 2pm to 6pm, however, look out for 'local to you' events that may be taking place.
